A long-time fan of Fab Nobs, she also joined the Fab Nobs committee earlier this year. Sally is continually amazed by the energy and talent of these 8-16 yr olds. She is thrilled to once again to be working with Amy Bryans (her partner in crime in Ragtime) and her daughter, Maeghan as choreographer.
