It was about 10 years ago that I purchased the original cast recording of "It's a Bird... It's a Plane... It's SUPERMAN!" After listening to the distinctively 'Bye Bye Birdieish' songs I couldn't understand how this mad cap and somewhat unconventional show isn't a staple in many theatre companies repertoire. Written in 1966 this musical comedy is packed full of every gimmick, bit, cliché, and gag from musical theatres golden age. After I read the script I fell in love with the production, the dialogue is so dated that I was laughing so hard, so much, and so loud that I knew the show had to be performed and in a smaller space. The music will have you humming and the dancing will have you tapping your toes. One of the questions posed for this production is how do you translate one of the most beloved comic book heroes onto the stage and make him sing and dance? With an outstandingly talented cast we have worked on realising classic two dimensional archetypes that jump off the page and into life in front of you. Paired with two dimensional props, amazingly colourful costumes by Nick Kong and clever comic book panel frames from Lighting Designer Vanessa Burke we have hopefully brought justice to the man of steel. Musical Director Danny Forward has had a huge challenge reorchestrating a huge (and almost illegible) score and transforming it into a 5 piece rock band that suits our version of 'Superman' perfectly. With a cast, band, crew, and creative team of about 25 creative people, we want to share a laugh with you tonight and I hope you enjoy the show as much as we have enjoyed bringing it to life. A big hearty thank you to everyone at Fab Nobs, they are a second family to me and most definitely my favourite company to work with. Thank you for

taking a chance on a show that on paper seemed

to expect the impossible. Up, up and away!!!

We are also so lucky to have Danny Matthews build our sets, he spends many long hours at e factory and one of Fab Nob's gems.



Superman!".




James is performing with




