

The year is 1980. Somewhere along the beach in Venice, California, Sonny Malone becomes frustrated with the mural he has painted of the nine muses of Greek nythology. After he storms off in frustration, the Muses come to life (I'm Alive) and Kira (a.k.a. Clio), conny's Muse, hatches a plan to inspire Sonny to artistic greatness. Gira disguises herself as a regular mortal from Australia and arrives at the Santa Monica pier just in time o rescue Sonny. Kira begins her work (Magic), and Sonny reveals his dream to open a roller disco. Inspiring Sonny brings Kira one step closer to being granted the gift of Xanadu. This infuriates sister Muses, Melpomene and Calliope, who hatch a plan to curse Kira so she falls in love with Sonny, a mortal,

which is forbidden (Evil Woman).
Sonny and Kira meet again in front of a rundown theater and receive a sign that things are coming ogether to fulfill Sonny's dream (Suddenly). Sonny meets with Danny, the owner of the theater, who is not interested in Sonny's plan until Kira enters and reminds him of someone he knew long ago

Whenever You're Away From Me).

eventually Danny agrees to give Sonny the theater if he can fix it up by the end of the day. Kira arrives, and they begin planning, providing Melpomene and Calliope with the moment they have been

waiting for (Strange Magic).
Left with only one hour to restore the theater, the Muses enter and help with the job (All Over The World). With the theater restored, Danny is back in show business, and Sonny's dreams are coming true. The two of them admire the Xanadu sign, while Kira receives a message via Hermes from Zeus reminding her of the rules she must live by. Realizing her feelings, Kira tries to leave, but Sonny begs her to stay (Don't Walk Away).

Stephen has trained in all aspects of the performing arts from a young age and graduated from Monash University with Bachelor of Performing Arts in 2010. During his time at Monash, he appeared as Nick Bottom in 'A Midsummer Night's Dream, 'Mother Courage and her Children' and a self-devised cabaret performed at The Butterfly Club. In 2012, Stephen furthered his professional development, pursuing full time musical theatre training at SHOWFIT, which gave him the opportunity to study under leading industry professionals.

During his time at SHOWFIT, Stephen appeared in workshop productions of 'The Silver Donkey' (Papa/Elephant/King), 'Under Milk Wood' (Captain Cat) and the Graduate Showcase. Further musical theatre credits Reporter/Ensemble in 'Floyd Collins', Chip in 'Spelling Bee' and 'Seussical - The Musical'. Stephen also trained and performed extensively with the Young Australian Broadway Chorus

(CPCA) for the majority of his childhood and teenage years. In 2013, Stephen appeared in the Magnormos Production of 'Children of Eden' as well as debuting his first solo cabaret show, 'FAT BOY SLIMM...ER', which will return for a full season later this year. Most recently, Stephen made his rural Victorian theatre debut, performing in the Wonthaggi Theatrical Group's concert, Bend it like Broadway.

Musical Director - Simon D'Aquino

Most recently Simon Musically Directed '[title of show]' for Fab Nobs last year and he is thrilled to be back. Simon works as a freelance accompanist throughout Melbourne for choirs, schools, theatre companies and tertiary institutions. 
Choreographer - Sheona Gregg


wonderful show experience and particularly Stephen for teaching him all about #acting.

Angle Bedford - Euterpe, Muse of Music







James Terry - Thalia, Muse of Comedy


