FROM THE DIRECTOR

Zombies. Is this strange subject matter for a musical? Perhaps, but no stranger than talking man-eating plants, singing nuns, spelling bees, or Shakespearean spaceships. Fab Nobs continue their tradition of presenting offbeat niche musicals, and I'm fortunate to be in the driver's seat for *Zombie Prom*.

I was first introduced to Zombie Prom while working on The Witches of Eastwick, another musical by John Dempsey and Dana P. Rowe. There are many similarities between the two shows, both in music and story structure. What seems to head neatly towards 'teen comedy musical' takes a sharp turn at 'cheesy horror melodrama' (a pet genre of mine).

Finding the style for this show was fun. Rather than go 'Comic Book' (as the mini-movie version did), I opted for a parody of bad 1950s teen horror movies. This allows us to venture down a path of much potential hilarity: the terrible acting and predictable plot twists, cardboard scenery that looks like it might fall over at any time, badly timed sound effects and moments where actors seem to step out of character to narrate key plot points. As well as all that, the structure of the show is quite similar to that of a melodrama – the clear hero and villain are established right off the bat and we identify them as such from beginning to end.

The world of the show is very recognizable, cliché in fact, and yet is completely skewed – so outrageous are the characters that Jonny, the zombie in question, seems to be the most normal of them all.

The cast and production team have had a blast creating this show for your enjoyment. My congratulations and thanks goes to every person who has helped bring this production to life. Now we ask you to cast your mind back to those Friday nights watching late night horror flicks, or sitting at the drive-in with popcorn in hand, and allow us to bring you our interpretation of *Zombie Prom*.

GYNOPSIG

It's just another day at "Enrico Fermi High" However, the school's tyrannical principal, Miss Delilah Strict, senses trouble in the

shape of transfer student Jonny Warner. In addition to his rebellious demeanour, Jonny has taken up with Miss Strict's star pupil, Toffee. Jonny and Toffee's friends are abuzz with this hallway romance, but Miss Strict bullies the girl into leaving Jonny. Despondent, Jonny hurls himself into the main waste treatment silo of the local nuclear plant.

Three weeks later, Toffee is still haunted by the memory of her dead boyfriend. Imagine her surprise when Jonny reappears at school, a genuine teenage nuclear zombie.

Meanwhile, word of this toxic teenager finds its way straight to the desk of seedy ace reporter Eddie Flagrante. Smelling a hot story, Eddie heads to Enrico Fermi High.

Jonny pleads with Toffee to take him back despite his advanced state of decomposition, and accompany him to the prom. Toffee is unsure whether she should take her boyfriend back, rigor mortis and all, but Miss Strict steadfastly refuses Jonny's request to return to school and finish his senior year.

While the student body argues the pros and cons of Toffee's relationship with her gangrenous beau, Eddie charges in. Even the sight of a rotting teenager pales in comparison with the shock Eddie gets when he sees Miss Strict. Obviously, the two share a rather juicy history. Eddie argues Jonny's right to come back, a classic case of civil rights. Miss Strict will not budge, though, on account of the school rule: "No Zombies". The cadaver can't return. End of story.

ACTI

Jonny has become a new sensation, as the school is thrown into turmoil. After school sport and the pep squad are canceled as Miss Strict clamps down on unruly behaviour. Miss Strict makes her intentions clear: if the zombie steps foot inside the school, the prom will be cancelled! Eddie drags Jonny onto television, where Jonny gets to plead with his true love to take him back. At home, studying for her finals, Toffee watches this on TV, and after a phone call from her friends, considers her difficult situation. Does she obey Miss Strict and stay home? Or does she take Jonny back and go to the Prom?

Toffee makes her choice to arrive at the prom alone, but is closely followed by Jonny. As Jonny and Toffee are reunited and crowned Prom King and Queen, the moment is trumped by the appearance of Miss Strict, who is pulling the plug on the whole evening. Eddie appears and reveals some secrets of his own, leading the whole group to the thrilling surprise conclusion to our story.

Kieran Tracey - Joey





ZOUBIE TRIVIA, FICTS AND WISTORY

There are three types of Zombies, all named after Zombi, the voodoo snake god or possibly the West African word "zumbi" meaning "fetish". All three enjoy what is commonly called cannibalism, although that would be technically incorrect since they are no longer human. The term "zombie" only came into general civilized world use in 1929, after the publication of William B. Seabrook's book, The Magic Island.

The first two types of zombies usually come from black magic practiced in the Caribbean, typically in Haiti. Zombies created by magic are often controlled by the bokor, or voodoo sorcerers who call the bodies forth from graves. They seem to have no sense of self-awareness. It it has been lilegal to make zombies in Haiti since 1835. Zombies are also rumored to be created from living people by using a combination tetrodotoxin, found in Japanese puffer fish, and an unknown hallucinogen.

It is worth pointing out that zombies produced through magical or simple chemical means are slow moving. Although it should be noted that the apparent slow movement is sufficient speed to keep the zombie no more than a few yards away from even a running Olympic caliber athlete. It is also important to note that zombies are universally fearful of bright lights and fire, are unusually strong (even the slow ones) and can only be killed by a severe head/brain injury or decapitation.

In film, primarily conceived in George Romero's 1968 classic, Night of the Living Dead, zombies came forth because "the was no more room in hell". Other films, including Night of the Comet, The Last Man on Earth and The Omega Man indicate that through comet droppings, scientific means or even a type of vampire. Plan 9 From Outer Space indicated a possible UFO or Alien connection. Most would agree that the second zombie on Illm, The Mummy (1932, featuring Boris Karloff), was a creature brought back for simple revenge. The first zombies on film were feared in 1932's White Zombie, starring Bela Lugosi.

Much more dangerous is the scientifically developed zombie. These creatures seem to have boundless energy, superhuman strength, enhanced speed and sometimes moderate intelligence. These first appeared once CGI made super-fast zombie movement visually possible. Films like the Resident Evil series, 28 Days Later and the Dawn of the Dead remake showcased this new zombie behavior. 2004's Shaun of the Dead went with the classic slow-moving zombies.

Trapped in a world of Zombies? What to do?

1. Stay calm. If zombie movies have taught us anything, screaming like a little girl, whether you are a man or woman will get you killed for sure.
2. If you find yourself surrounded by zombies, an unproven but possibly effective method of escape could very well by entering their midst and acting like one of them. This worked for Shaun and his friends.

3. Avoid population centers, and only go to markets and malls during daylight hours.


4. It goes without saying that you should barricade yourself, but we're telling you to anyway.
